

Voice change

- In grammar, "Voice" means the form of verb by which the relation of the subject to the action implied is indicated.
- Lakshya In other words, voice is the form of the verb which indicates whether the subject does the work or something has been done to it.

(i) Active voice Lakshya





ACTIVE VOICE

- When the subject of a sentence is the doer of the action, the verb is in the active voice. It is so because the subject is active.
- The active voice describes a sentence where the subject directly performs the Lakshya action.

She/he does the work

 When the subject of a sentence is acted upon, the verb is in passive voice. It is so because the subject is passive.

For example-
